Letter from Larry

It is hard to believe that Corners Outreach celebrates eight years of changing lives this year. I have learned so much by getting to be part of this awe-inspiring work, and I am very thankful.

Inside our annual report you will see lots of information, pictures and stories on Corners Academy and Corners Industries. Our pictures show the wonderful, beautiful and sometime traumatized people that we have the honor to work with every day.

Corners is trying to change today and forge a better tomorrow, and that brings two kinds of challenges:

- **Technical challenge** – All students reading on grade level, which has been linked directly with high school graduation. Corners has the tools to improve our students reading levels & works tirelessly to do so.
- **Adaptive challenge** - The value of education. This is much harder to see and somewhat depends on the person's context. It requires developed relationships and trust. Adaptive challenges cannot be solved with one's existing knowledge, skills and tools. It requires people to make a shift in values, expectations, attitudes or habits of behavior.

I truly believe that many programs completely miss the adaptive challenges, which results in only temporary changes. **Adaptive challenges require those impacted to become leaders of the change.**

Breaking problems into these two categories helps us choose the right tool and build a team that can implement those tools for maximum impact.

With your help, we've made a lot of progress over the

last two years. Our unique Three Paths of Impact (see the chart on pg. 5) gives us a great way of connecting our community. Our primary focus has been:

1. We hired an Instructional Designer with a history of ESOL teaching in Gwinnett County to help us **create a curriculum that complements the teachers' work, ties to the Georgia milestones and creates improved academic outcomes** for our students.
2. We hired **part-time certified teachers** from partner schools to lead groups of students through this curriculum.
3. Through a partnership with Atlanta Speech School (thanks to Comer Yates and Nitza Vega Lahr) we **launched an Early Learning Program** which works with moms and infants/toddlers (ages 0-5) and is offered weekly at three locations & provided in native language (Spanish, English and French).
4. Through parent workshops, parent days at Academy, and more, we are consistently **increasing the role of the parents in their child's life**. Adaptive challenges are best solved with the parents.
5. With **95% of our families living in poverty**, through Corners Industries, we continue to **hire at a living wage** and **connect parents to better paying jobs**.

In looking forward, I want you to think with me. Our plan for the next three years is **E, 2x, +2, +3 = K**.

E - Extend. Corners Academy's focus was primarily elementary school because of important metrics like third grade reading level, but we learned that our students were behind entering elementary school so we extended into Early Learning. We now will extend into middle school. Today only 1 in 4 of our elementary students continue

with Corners Academy after fifth grade. Much of the academic success is getting lost and so is the relationship needed to stay the course.

2X - Double the Students. Corners Academy has concentrated the last two year in tools and methods to improve academic outcomes and has been putting growth on hold. It is time to do both.

+2 - 2 New Industries. As you will read in our Corners Industries section, our whole family focus on education and living wages is working. Using Asset Based Community Development method, we are updating our surveys with emphasis on moms and teens. These groups have so much untapped potential that will benefit them as well as our community.

+3 - Added Leadership to Corners. To achieve our E, 2x, +2, +3 = K, Corners must add leadership for adaptive challenges which create lasting change. These leaders need experience in change management, managing relationships, great listening habits and a love for all people. **Are you interesting in joining our team?**

K - An additional 1,000 lives will be impacted. Everyone connected will be impacted and will forever see life differently. Today's children will be tomorrow's community leaders. **Change is hard but necessary and ultimately inspiring: seeing a student read and solve problems or a parent hired into a better job slowly helps achieve the dream of a full life.**

I love this African Proverb: If you want to go fast, go alone. If you want to go far, go together.

In closing, I wanted to share one of my biggest hopes for the next year, which is to **help more families have a support system through connecting with a church.** This past year, we had three mothers pass away. Corners was the only place those families could turn for support and to help with home placement and funeral arrangements. Many of our families feel utterly alone, and it breaks my heart.

At Corners, we believe **we are all Better Together.** Thank you for joining us in this journey.

Corners Academy

After School Tutoring

453 Students

In 2019, Corners Academy tutored over 450 students, from elementary to high school. Only 26% of our students are on their correct reading grade level which means 74% are between 1-6 levels behind. We work diligently every day at club to improve by incorporating a reading curriculum created specifically for second language learners.

221 Active Parents

Parents are critical in education. We realized quickly that to achieve our mission of 100% high school graduation, we had to have significant involvement with the parents. In 2019, we had over 160 parents attend workshops and events to build relationships and trust, and to help them understand the importance of education.

267 Volunteers

Over 250 people from all ages volunteered their time to Corners in 2019. Our volunteers range from middle and high school students who serve regularly, to retirees, and everyone in between.

9 Elementary Schools

Corners Academy's primary focus is elementary schools. We partner with nine schools with four clubs in Gwinnett and Dekalb counties. Our Directors spent over 600 hours in the schools this year, serving, collaborating and assisting parents, students, teachers and administration.

Early Learning

In January, Corners began running Early Learning sessions at three of our Corners Academy locations. Our focus is to educate moms and facilitate fun for babies and toddlers 0-5 that builds their brains, engages moms in new ways, and prepares the child for kindergarten. Using fun activities like singing nursery rhymes, reading books, and doing crafts, we help these children learn the alphabet, shapes and

colors, counting, and basic skills like using scissors and crayons.

One mother told Pilar that after coming to one of our Early Learning sessions, she had the confidence to read to her two-year-old at home for the first time! We know that reading at home is key indicator for staying on grade level once school starts, so this means great things for that upcoming student's future.

When someone asks me how to get more involved in the community, I say, 'Go see Corners Outreach.' Working with Corners Outreach is truly a win-win for us at Kingsley Elementary. We work with the program directors regularly, so we are aware of which students attend Corners Academy and how often they are there, and we have seen an improvement academically because of this. In the summer of 2019, we tracked every student who attended Corners summer program and saw that there was no summer slide backward and, in many cases, we saw improvement for the students. And the best part was that our teachers took part in the program and taught at Corners this summer so there was true consistency and true partnership, as well as a pure excitement over the whole summer program.

Two New Initiatives

One of our greatest challenges has been helping students improve in reading and math fast enough to be on grade level. **One third of Corners students are 4-6 reading levels behind, and one third are more than 6 reading levels behind.** It is a huge undertaking to get back on reading level when you are that behind, and many of our students are challenged with limited English ability.

In order to address this challenge, Corners:

- Hired an Instructional Designer to create curriculum to catch students up and get them on grade level.
 - * The new curriculum has been implemented for one year.
- Hired part-time certified teachers to implement the curriculum in small groups.
 - * Specialized reading and math groups
 - * Frees up program directors and volunteers to work individually as needed

While the reasons for each student being so far behind may vary from person to person, the main causes are:

- Poverty
- Low access to resources
- Limited English
- Parents without a high school degree

Our long term goals for every Corners student are:

- Be on reading level
- Complete middle school
- Graduate high school

Because we've added a curriculum and part-time certified teachers, our numbers have increased, but they are still a small percentage of the students at our partner schools. With an average of 90% free and reduced lunch and 70% English Language Learners, we plan to continue to increase the number of students who join Corners Academy.

Vision: Corners Outreach exists to transform students, parents and neighbors to reach God-given potential, break cycles of poverty and improve our community.

A Personal Story

Jesús is a 2nd grader from Lilburn Elementary who began regularly attending Corners Academy in August of last year. When he began, Jesús was at a kindergarten level in reading and math. He simply couldn't keep up with the second-grade work, so he had to do different work in school than his classmates. But by coming Corners Academy regularly and working extremely hard, Jesus has already moved up to a first grade level in both reading and math and is on track to be on second grade level in both by the end of April! Jesús has improved with his sight words and is currently more than half way through first grade sight words, having learned all 100 of his kindergarten sight words.

Jesús has a great attitude – he knows he's behind, but he doesn't complain about having to do the younger grade's work because he understands that it helps him. He's determined to get better, and he comes in with a smile every single day. In December, Corners had a sight-word competition with the K-2 students, and Jesús went home

the night before and asked his mom to work with him for two hours on sight words. Jesús arrived for the competition and knew every single one!

Jesus' mom, Maria, is a very active part of the Corners community as well, and actively works to help Jesús catch up. Maria is the mother of five children, ages one and half to sixteen years old. She's a very loving mom who gives hugs and support to her children. She attends our Early Learning Program every week with her two youngest children – Ruby who is three and Scander, who is one and a half.

Maria has shared with us how grateful she is to have Corners Academy help her children succeed in school. She understands they are struggling and wants to do all she can to help them. Maria and her husband, Jose, live in a small apartment with their seven-person family, and Jose works long hours doing construction to make ends meet. The whole family came to the Thanksgiving Celebration and shared how grateful they are to have our community.

Community & Family Engagement

Corners Outreach is in a unique position due to its high emphasis on parent and family engagement. At Corners, we believe that parents are integral to the success of our students, and we invite them in, regularly.

In the 2018-2019 school year, we employed many techniques to increase family engagement and parent involvement, including:

- Hiring bilingual Hispanic leaders for our programs
- Adding parent workshops focused on the importance of reading levels, math levels and social-emotional learning skills, so parents can monitor their child's success.
- Adding days parents can participate at club and read with their children.
- Sending home reading logs and awarding parents and students for reading
- Being a voice for families in the community, educating the teachers and school leadership on the troubles inherent with these populations such as
 - Short-term seasonal work,
 - Immigration policies, and

- Differences between the Mexican/ Central American and American educational systems.

This year, we hosted multiple celebratory days for the whole family. A few examples from last Fall are:

- **Fall Festival at Nesbit Elementary** in collaboration with the nonprofit Creating Connected Communities, which brought **more than 450 people** out on a rainy day for games, dancing, free books, lunch and Halloween costumes.
- Our annual **Thanksgiving celebration** in partnership with Corners Church and Berkeley Lake Elementary had more than **415 people** attend for family portraits, lunch, a bag of groceries and hats/gloves items for kids.
- **International Thanksgiving Day** at Corners Academy Meadowcreek and Hightower/ Kingsley locations brought together **more than 100 individuals** each.

By looking at bigger ways to connect our families to Corners and to one another, we build a trusted community who can support & help one another.

When you throw terms around like 'illegal' we miss seeing that these are people. They are adorable people and we need to look at them with open hearts. Corners and Larry are making a great difference in these lives and I say THANK YOU.

What makes Corners Outreach really unique is that they are providing direct services, but they are also having conversations that are much broader in the community, educating the general public about immigration and how to be better neighbors. Not only are they focused on the families and children that they serve, they are really in tune to what's happening throughout metro Atlanta. Corners does a really good job of listening to the community and then taking that information back to the community leaders to implement change.

Census

This year, Corners is engaging in a community-wide effort to increase the 2020 Census count in our neighborhoods. The census is a constitutional requirement to assess the number of people living in America, with the goal to count every single person living in each country at one time.

When we look at the landscape of the northeast corridor of metro Atlanta, there have been significant demographic shifts since the last census count in 2010. And keep in mind that count **missed more than one million children**. According to the Georgia Department of Education, public school **enrollment for Hispanic students is up more than 303%** between 2000 and 2015.

At Corners we believe that every immigrant deserves a pathway to a solid education, a good job, a living wage, and an opportunity to thrive in the U.S.

By participating in the Census, we:

- Empower our community to be more civically engaged
- Remind our families that they matter and deserve to be counted,

The result is more financial assistance and resources. The census doesn't include barriers because of status or age, as voting does. A high school student who's not old enough to vote could be the family member filling out the census and saying, *we matter & we will be counted*. An undocumented person can fill out the census and realize the government will help fund their child's education. We are engaging our teens in helping with canvassing, text banking, and educating.

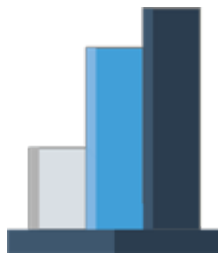

In the last fifteen years, Hispanics in Georgia have grown by more than 120%. While they are grateful to call Atlanta home, many are struggling to make ends meet. The main challenges they face are

- Income inequality - metro Atlanta is recognized by Bloomberg as the worst in the nation for income inequality, and it continues to grow.
- Children's Wellness - The United Way's Child-Well Being Map shows an overall score of wellness for children at 58.9 in metro Atlanta but just 24 in the area Corners serves.

Corners Industries' solution is innovative in these ways:

- Bridges wealthy and poor communities in the work of social good
- Teaches families to be self-sustaining
- Teaches students to read, stay in school and graduate high school
- Connects with business leaders on economic impact
- Connects with school leaders on academic impact
- Connects with people living in these communities by being on the front line with them

When I learned about how Corners Outreach was helping the community through educating and tutoring kids, that brought a new aspect to landscaping that I had never thought of before. Having been in the landscape industry for over 20 years, I had never encountered anyone who was giving back so much to the community. And I feel very fortunate to be a part of that now.

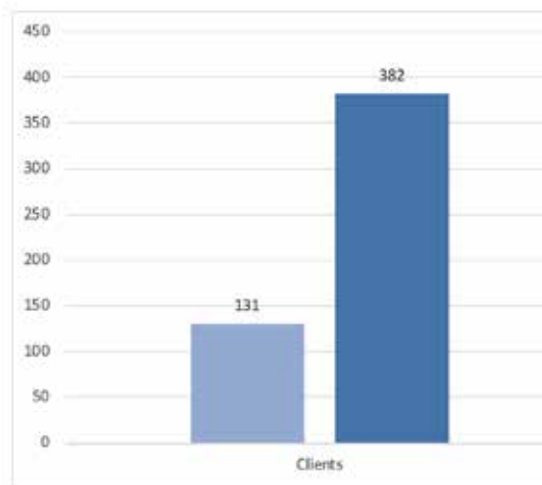

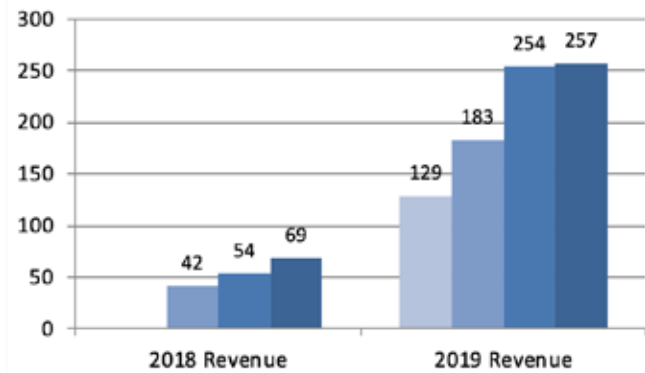

There are many ideas in process to grow the landscaping industry and to add additional industries, based on the assets of our parents, including:

- Cleaning/repair of apartment complexes, schools and elder care facilities
- Handyman program
- Translation services
- Call centers

Corners has begun to survey our teens looking at three pathways:

1. Four-year university
2. Community college
3. Apprenticeships

Many of our teens are bilingual which is in great demand, and Corners foresees creating businesses to provide better paying jobs and work environments.

Many of our families have limited education and experience in breaking out of poverty. Making more money is always the priority, and education can take a backseat since long-term financial stability is difficult to grasp. This often translates to students dropping out of high school to bring money to their family now, rather than continuing towards graduation and creating a better life long-term. Continued communication, relationship building and community involvement with the parents, as well as the students, are critical to make long-term changes.

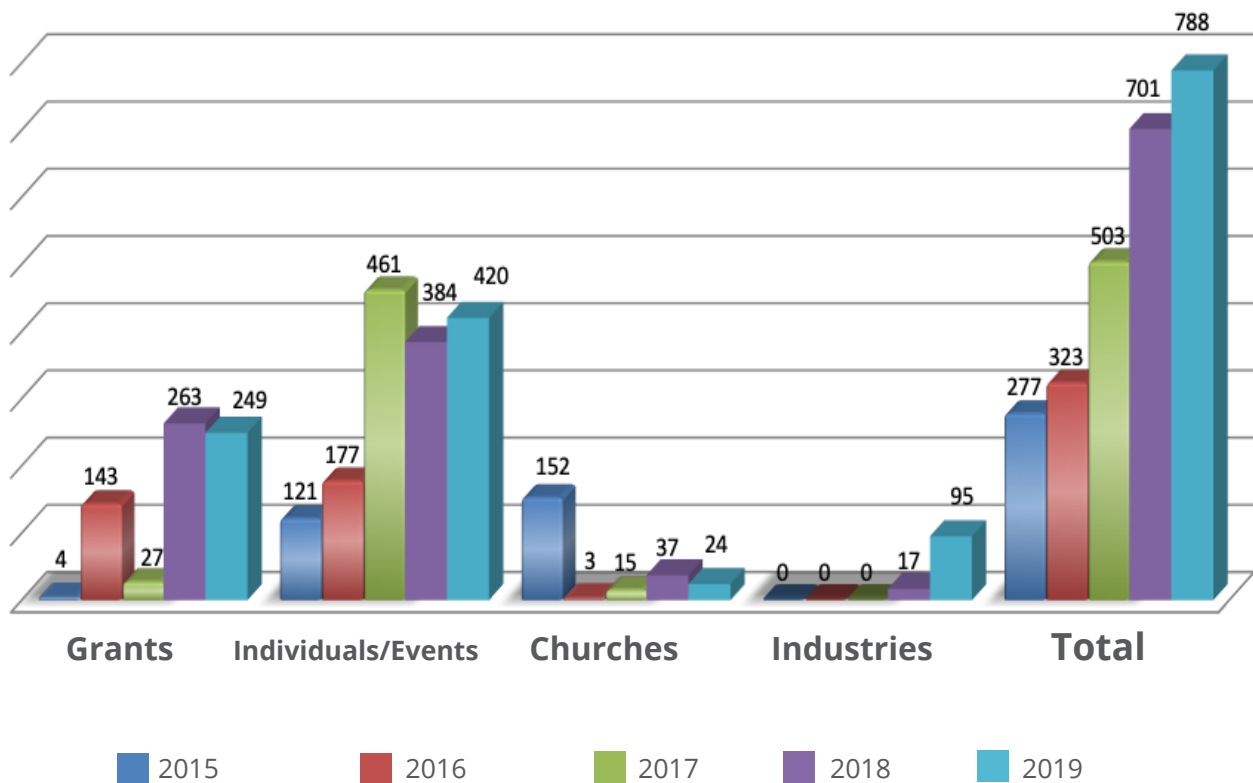

Revenue Comparison 2015-2019



- Of Corners Academy expenditures in 2019:
83% - program costs **4% - administration** **13% - fundraising**
- While Corners Industries is part of Corners Outreach, we manage it as a separate profit center. 15% of all Corners Industries revenue is donated to Corners Academy. In 2019, that amounted to **\$95,000** or a **full year of tutoring for 95 students**.
